



Child support

What happens with your application?

You apply for child support with the Guardianship Council CN. You can do this during the consultation hours or by email via: kinderalimentatie@rijksdienstcn.com

The Guardianship Council makes an independent calculation with a standard model. This calculation takes the financial situation of both parents, the needs of the child / the children, how many children the father and the mother have, and how often during the week they stay with the father and the mother into account. The Guardianship Council issues an opinion with the calculation for the court.

The opinion is sent to the court, this is called an application. The parents do not need to pay for this. The parents receive an invitation for the hearing at the court. An employee of the Guardianship Council will also be present to provide an explanation with the opinion. During the hearing the judge asks the parents questions and the content of the application is discussed. At the end of the hearing the judge explains when a ruling is issued.

The decision, or ruling, of the court on paper is referred to as a decree. After receipt of the decree, the Guardianship Council sends a copy to each parent. This contains the obligations and the level of the amount that must monthly be contributed for the child. If a parent disagrees with the decision of the court then they can file a notice of objection. This is also referred to as "to appeal" against the ruling of the court. The parent can file this via a lawyer.

For the collection and payment of the child support, the Guardianship Council cooperates with the Belastingdienst CN. The Belastingdienst CN receives the money from the paying parent and pays this to the receiving parent. Both parents receive a letter from the Guardianship Council in which it is mentioned what information the Belastingdienst CN requires.

The parent who must pay child support receives 1 reminder from the Belastingdienst if payment fails to materialise. After that the Guardianship Council can have money withheld from the salary via the employer.

If this is unsuccessful then the Guardianship Council can take other steps, e.g. send a bailiff.

This is only possible if the requesting parent has information about the place of abode, the assets, and the bank account number of the parent who must pay. The Guardianship Council pays a part of the costs, the parents also pay a part.
